Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.** It is right, and a good and joyful thing, Always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Lord God Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

You created for yourself a world filled with diversity and blessed by your breath of life.
Rainbow colors bloom in spring,
summer breezes bring garden delight,
and now as Autumn comes our way
we see the work of your paintbrush upon every face and tree.

In mercy, while we still held to the chains of our winter,
of pride, self-righteousness, and historic egos
you loved us steadfastly and delivered us as babes
to reflect the beauty and diversity of your grace,
to bring us into a community of love, hope, and peace.

And so,
with all your people on earth
in every place where two or more are gathered in your name

The cup over which we give thanks is a sharing in the blood of Christ.

GIVING THE BREAD AND CUP

The bread and wine are given to the people, with these or other words being exchanged:

The body of Christ, given for you. **Amen.**

The blood of Christ, given for you. **Amen.**

The congregation sings hymns while the bread and cup are given.

When all have received, the Lord’s table is put in order.

The following prayer is then offered by the pastor or by all:

Lord hear the prayers of those who gather at your table of unity and love. By doing the work you have entrusted to us may we sustain our life on earth and build up your kingdom in faith. Grant this through Christ our Lord.

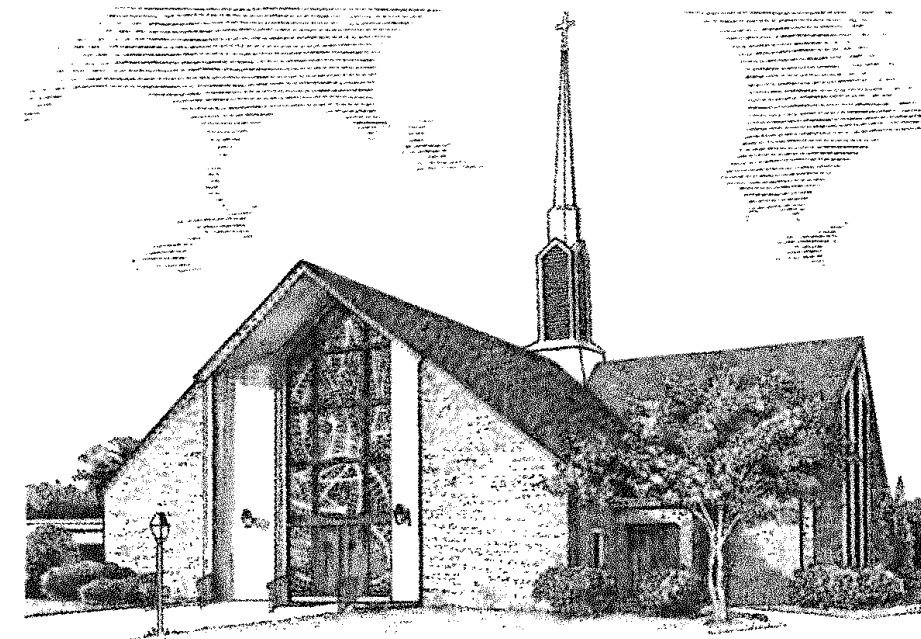

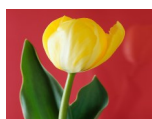
